

FoS Credit Transfer Policy (from AY26/27)

Science Dean's Office (SDO), Faculty of Science, NUS
2 September 2026

What is Credit Transfer?

- Credit transfer refers to the process of having academic credits obtained at an external institution transferred to NUS such that the credits count towards NUS degree requirements.
- Course mapping is required for credit transfer to take place. Note that **course mapping is not the same as credit transfer**.
- Course mapping only indicates if a partner university course is suitable to be mapped to an NUS course. Having an approved mapping does not mean that the mapped NUS course count towards degree requirements, if credit transfer is not initiated.
- **Course mappings are reviewed by course host departments while credit transfer is processed by the home faculty.**

Applicable Programme Types

This credit transfer policy applies to the following programme types:

- Student Exchange Programme (SEP)
- Summer/Winter Programmes (SWP), including self-sourced
- Singapore Universities Student Exchange Programme (SUSEP)
- Research* Attachments (RIAP), including self-sourced

*For research conducted during SEP, research attachments (both NUS-administered and self-sourced) and Overseas Summer UROPS (FoS-administered), refer to [Credit Transfer for Research](#) for details.

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Guidelines for Credit Transfer

Eligibility Criteria for Credit Transfer

The following criteria must be fulfilled for credits to be transferred:

- a. The partner university course must be **taken in-person**. Online courses* are not eligible for credit transfer.
- b. The partner university course must be **credit-bearing** (i.e. course credits are clearly listed in the transcript).
- c. The student must have **passed** the partner university course and be awarded credits for it.
- d. The partner university course must be **successfully mapped** to an NUS course in the course mapping worksheet.
- e. Only **academic courses** offered by the partner university can be mapped.

*For summer/winter programmes, students who choose to read blended courses (i.e. choice of either in-person or online classes) must provide official documentation from the partner university to prove that all classes were attended in-person.

How Many NUS Units Will I Receive?

The number of NUS units that you receive from each partner university course is calculated individually based on the credit equivalence of NUS courses to the partner university courses.

Full Workload @ Partner University = Full Workload @ NUS

e.g. 30 ECTS (European PUs) = 20 NUS units

5 ECTS = 3.33 NUS units $\approx$ 4 NUS units (rounded up)

Please use the [SEP Credit Transfer Calculator](#) to calculate how many units you will receive in total, provided the eligibility criteria for credit transfer is fulfilled. The calculator allows you to calculate specific to the PU and provides the equivalent NUS units for each individual PU course.

Using the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator

The following example shows the number of NUS units (20 units) that a student receives from completing 5 courses at Cornell University.

Credit Transfer Limit (by programme type)

Student Exchange Programme (SEP)

- A **maximum of 24 units** can be transferred.
- There is no minimum number of units required for credit transfer. However, please plan carefully as underloading may lead to an extension of candidature and therefore additional fees.

Summer/Winter Programmes (SWPs)

- A **maximum of 10 units** can be transferred for **each summer programme** and a **maximum of 5 units for each winter programme**. Students may participate in **up to 2 SWPs** and transfer **up to 12 units in total**. Summer research programmes are also considered SWPs.
- Credits can be transferred for more than 2 SWPs or more than 12 units in total. However, special term fees will be charged in such cases. It is not possible to transfer more than 10 units per summer programme or more than 5 units per winter programme.

For all programmes

- Students should take note of the Minimum Unit Requirements for Programme/Major/Second Major, Minor and Specialisations, and the Residency Requirement as stipulated by the Office of the University Registrar (OUR).

Relevance of Course Mapping

- Credits are transferred only for approved mappings that are selected for credit transfer in the course mapping worksheet.
- In most cases, for each partner university course, the equivalent NUS units (calculated using the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator) is equal to the units of the mapped NUS course – typically 4 NUS units.
- In some cases, the equivalent NUS units could be more than or fewer than the units of the mapped NUS course. In such cases, adjustments to the credit transfer processing of these courses are required. Refer to the following slides for details.

Credit Transfer Arrangement:

Calculated Equivalent Units > Units of Mapped NUS Course

Scenario	Credit Transfer Arrangement
Calculated Equivalent Units > Units of Mapped NUS Course	Option 1: Credit transfer to mapped NUS course + Assign dummy course code (Faculty/Department course code) to recognise excess units earned.
	Option 2: Credit transfer to mapped NUS course + Excess units earned to compensate another mapped NUS course with deficit in PU units earned

Credit Transfer Arrangement:

Calculated Equivalent Units < Units of Mapped NUS Course

Scenario	Credit Transfer Arrangement
Calculated Equivalent Units < Units of Mapped NUS Course	Option 1: Credit transfer to mapped NUS course on the condition that excess units from another mapping is used to compensate the shortfall in units.
	Option 2: Units earned to compensate another mapped NUS course with deficit in PU units earned + Assign dummy course code to recognise remaining units (if any) earned. In this case, there is no credit transfer to the NUS course that is originally mapped to .



Credit Transfer for Research

Is Research Eligible for Credit Transfer?

- To transfer credits for research programmes, the following criteria must be met:
 - Research is tagged to a course (with course code), and credits are awarded.
 - Assessment is conducted by the host university, and a transcript will be issued.
 - The research course code, title and credits must be shown in the transcript. The mark or grade awarded should also be shown.
 - Other eligibility criteria listed [here](#) must be fulfilled.
- For mapping of research, refer to the **course mapping instructions** found on the [FoS SEP website](#).
- Credit equivalence for research programmes/courses is calculated the same way as other (coursework) courses, as described in this document.
- The number of credits that can be transferred is included in the [limit for SEP or SWP](#), depending on the programme type.

Exceptions to the Credit Transfer Policy

- SEP to Institute of Science Tokyo (YSEP only)
 - While the Young Science and Engineering Researchers Program (YSEP) is not credit-bearing, it is possible to transfer up to 4 NUS units for completion of YSEP. Course mapping must be approved, and a certificate of completion must be submitted in place of a transcript.
- Overseas Summer UROPS (FoS-administered only)
[effective from AY25/26 Special Term]
 - Credit transfer will not follow the eligibility criteria and credit equivalence stated in this document.
 - All research projects conducted will earn up to 4 NUS units. No additional units will be given even if the calculated equivalent units exceed 4 units.
 - Course mapping must be approved, and a transcript must be submitted. For PUs that do not issue transcripts, an assessment form should be completed and submitted in place of the transcript.

Summary

Programme Type	Credit Transfer Arrangement
Student Exchange Programme (SEP)	Research must be tagged to a course and award credits. Units to be transferred for the research is calculated using the SEP credit transfer calculator. Exception for YSEP at Institute of Science Tokyo: Research is not credit-bearing, but the student can be awarded 4 units.
Summer Research Attachment (administered by GRO)	Research must be tagged to a course and award credits. Units to be transferred for the research is calculated using the SEP credit transfer calculator.
Overseas Summer UOPS (administered by FoS) [effective from AY25/26 Special Term]	Students can transfer only 4 units of credits, even if the calculated equivalent credit is more than that. For PUs that do not issue transcripts, the assessment form from SDO will be used in place.
Self-sourced Summer Research	Research must be tagged to a course and award credits. Units to be transferred for the research is calculated using the SEP credit transfer calculator.



Credit Transfer Process & Instructions

Only for students whose home faculty is FoS

Onus is on students to initiate credit transfer upon return from overseas programmes.

FoS will not be responsible for any failure to transfer credits due to non-submission of results or failure to meet credit transfer requirements.

How to Request for Credit Transfer (1)

Before requesting for credit transfer, please ensure that you have met the following requirements:

1. **Completed course mapping in EduRec** for all partner university courses you wish to transfer credits for.
2. **Selected the mappings for credit transfer** and clicked on the **REQUEST FOR CREDIT TRANSFER** button*.
3. Have a copy of the **partner university transcript**** in English. The transcript should clearly state your name, the name of the partner university, the number of credits for each course, course codes, course titles and marks/grades.
4. Filled in the **SEP Credit Transfer Conversion Table** in the [SEP Credit Transfer Calculator](#).

*Once you have clicked on the button, you will no longer be able to make changes to your course mapping worksheet.

**A screenshot of your results is accepted as an alternative to the transcript, provided all necessary information listed above is shown.

How to Request for Credit Transfer (2)

To request for credit transfer, submit* a copy of your **partner university transcript** and a copy of the **filled SEP Credit Transfer Calculator** to the Dean's Office via [SCI UG Queries](#) (category: SAP).

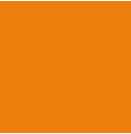

No acknowledgement email will be sent to you after you have submitted the documents.

*For credit transfer of research programmes/courses, an additional submission is required to verify that the project completed is the same as the project approved in the course mapping worksheet.



How Long Does Credit Transfer Take?

Please note that credit transfer is a manual process and takes time. Please **allow up to 2 months** from the submission of the transcript to the completion of credit transfer.

No acknowledgement email will be sent to you after you have submitted the documents.

However, you will be **notified via email** once the credit transfer process has been completed. We seek your understanding to be patient.

Note: Only credits are transferred. **Grades are not transferred** and hence GPA is not affected. 'Overseas Satisfactory' (OVS) grade will be reflected in EduRec for courses which you have successfully transferred. However, only the number of credits transferred, and the name of partner university will be reflected in the NUS transcript.

Implications on CourseReg (1)

- Mapped NUS Courses are Pre-Requisites
 - Students who have mapped a PU course to an NUS course that is a pre-requisite to a higher level NUS course requires the pre-requisite that is mapped to be recognised, so that they can register for the higher-level course during CourseReg.
- Student Seniority
 - To be promoted to a higher degree level for higher priority during CourseReg, recognition of credits earned from partner university courses is necessary. Note that students will only be promoted to the next degree level if they have fulfilled the unit requirements for the degree level.

Implications on CourseReg (2)

To tackle the implications highlighted, students can **select mappings for credit transfer** and **click on the 'Request for Credit Transfer' button** in the EduRec course mapping worksheet **prior to CourseReg***.

This is an interim measure that allows the system to recognise that the mapped NUS course has been completed, hence fulfilling pre-requisite requirements. The corresponding credits will then be counted towards completed cumulative units, allowing promotion of degree level.

Note:

- Completion of the steps above **does not equate to completion of credit transfer**. Please follow the steps [here](#) to complete the credit transfer.
- Only select mappings of partner university courses that you have completed and passed. If the results at the partner university are not released and you are not confident that you will pass a course, **do not select the mapping for that course**.
- If you selected the mapping for a course that you failed and need to register for it during CourseReg, please write in to us via [SCI UG Queries](#) to unselect the relevant course(s).

*Please ensure that you complete this measure before the period for Academic Plan Declaration, prior to the start of CourseReg, as the system will take time to register the courses that you have requested for credit transfer.



Case Studies

Explanation of Case Studies

The following case studies provide examples of how credits are transferred in different scenarios. In all examples, the PU transcript and the EduRec course mapping worksheet ('Credit Transfer Request' tab) are illustrated. For credit transfer to be processed, students must submit the PU transcript and select mappings in the course mapping worksheet. The PU courses listed in the mapping worksheet must match the PU courses listed in the PU transcript.

In the illustration of the course mapping worksheet, all mappings listed are mappings that have been approved. If the checkbox is checked (☒) , the mapping is selected for credit transfer. If unchecked (☐) , the mapping is not selected for credit transfer.

Earned units from PU course (equivalent NUS units) are calculated using the [SEP Credit Transfer Calculator](#). Top-ups of units are done using SX dummy codes, which count towards Unrestricted Electives (UEs).

All case studies provided present examples and do not reflect actual mappings. Please do not use the examples given to justify approval for course mappings.

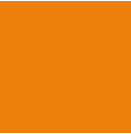

Calculated Equivalent Units = Units of Mapped NUS Course

Credit Transfer Process:

All mappings have calculated units (units earned from PU course) equal to the number of units of the mapped NUS course. No adjustments to the units earned are required.

Case Study 2:

Calculated Equivalent Units > Units of Mapped NUS Course

Credit Transfer Process:

All mappings have calculated units (units earned from PU course) more than the number of units of the mapped NUS course. Top-up of units is done by SDO during credit transfer processing. Students do not need to submit additional mappings to top-up units.

In this case study, the student has completed PU courses equivalent to 25 NUS units. However, they can only receive up to 24 NUS units, which is the cap for credit transfer for SEP. Mappings 1 – 5 are selected by the student for credit transfer, summing to a total of 20 NUS units. To receive 24 NUS units, SDO tops up 4 NUS units via **Mapping 6**.

Case Study 3:

Calculated Equivalent Units < Units of Mapped NUS Course

Credit Transfer Process:

All mappings have calculated units (units earned from PU course) fewer than the number of units of the mapped NUS course. To ensure that the credits transferred do not exceed the calculated equivalent units, not all mappings can be selected for credit transfer.

In this case study, the student has completed PU courses equivalent to 18 NUS units, with mappings (1 – 6) for these courses amounting to a total of 24 NUS units. Since only 18 NUS units can be transferred, only 4 mappings (of 4 NUS units each) can be selected for credit transfer. **Mappings 4 and 5** are not selected by the student to ensure that the total units received do not exceed 18.

Since the selected mappings (1 – 3, 6) amount to 16 NUS units, SDO tops up 2 NUS units via **Mapping 7** so that the student receives 18 NUS units in total. The student does not need to submit additional mappings to top-up units.

Case Study 4:

Calculated Equivalent Units $\neq$ Units of Mapped NUS Course

Credit Transfer Process:

Some mappings have calculated units (units earned from PU course) more than the number of units of the mapped NUS course, while other mappings have calculated units fewer than the number of units of the mapped NUS course. To ensure that the credits transferred do not exceed the calculated equivalent units, excess credits can be shifted from one mapping to another.

In this case study, the student has completed PU courses equivalent to 23 NUS units, with mappings (1 – 5) for these courses amounting to a total of 20 NUS units. To receive 23 NUS units, SDO tops up 3 NUS units via **Mapping 6**. The student does not need to submit additional mappings to top-up units.

Case Study 5: Total Units > 24 NUS Units

Credit Transfer Process:

Most mappings have calculated units (units earned from PU course) equal to the number of units of the mapped NUS course, except for Mapping 1. To ensure that the credits transferred do not exceed the cap of 24 NUS units for SEP, not all mappings can be selected for credit transfer.

In this case study, the student has completed PU courses equivalent to 29 NUS units, with mappings (1 – 7) for these courses amounting to a total of 28 NUS units. Due to the cap of 24 NUS units, only 6 mappings (of 4 NUS units each) can be selected for credit transfer. **Mapping 7** is not selected by the student to ensure that the total units received do not exceed 24.

Case Study 6: Other Scenarios

This case study presents the following scenarios:

- Student has an approved mapping for a PU course, but **did not complete** the PU course.
- Student has an approved mapping for a PU course, but **did not pass** the PU course.
- Student has completed and passed a PU course, which has an approved mapping, but the course is **not credit-bearing**.
- Student has completed and passed a PU course, but **does not have an approved mapping** for the course.

Case Study 6: Other Scenarios

Credit Transfer Process:

In this case study, the student has read 5 courses at the PU but did not complete or pass all 5 courses. One course is incomplete, one course did not obtain a passing grade, and one course is not credit-bearing. Even though the student has approved mappings (1 – 3) for these courses, the credit transfer eligibility criteria is not fulfilled.

Additionally, while the student has completed the PU course [MAN-BCU3022](#), there are no approved mappings for this course in the mapping worksheet. Hence, credit transfer cannot be processed for this PU course.

Case Study 7:

SWP – Total Units > Limit (10 for Summer, 5 for Winter)

Credit Transfer Process:

In this case study, the student has completed PU courses equivalent to 12 NUS units during a summer programme, with mappings (1 – 3) for these courses amounting to a total of 12 NUS units. Due to the credit transfer limit of 10 NUS units per summer programme, only 2 mappings (of 4 NUS units each) can be selected for credit transfer. Mapping 3 is not selected by the student to ensure that the total units received do not exceed 10. To receive 10 NUS units, SDO tops up 2 NUS units via Mapping 4. The student does not need to submit additional mappings to top-up units.

If the student wishes to transfer credits for Mapping 3 as well (and leave out Mapping 4), they can do so by paying Special Term fees for a 2-unit course.
